**Transfer Guidelines:**

- 1) To be competitive, the following criteria should be met: A cumulative GPA of a 2.00 and a satisfactory HESI exam score.
- 2) Grades of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale completed at regionally accredited colleges or universities are transferrable. Courses must be considered college level and have been used to fulfill graduation requirements and degree requirements at the previous college or university.
- 3) Remedial/pre-college level courses, audit, credit, proficiency scores are **not transferrable**.
- 4) No courses with final grades below 2.0 on a 4.0 scale may be transferred.
- 5) **Important Note: Anatomy & Physiology I and the College Algebra requirements** are considered expired for the BSIT-Pre-licensure program if taken more than 5 or more years prior to your intended start term. †
