



What are the admissions criteria I need to get into the program?

Overall GPA of a 2.75 or higher, science GPA of a 2.75 or higher, and a nursing GPA of 2.75 or higher.

What should I do if I do not meet all the criteria?

Students that believe they do not meet all of the criteria should reach out to their admissions counselor to go over options.



What pre-requisites expire?

Courses do not expire for this program. Please request a transcript evaluation by going to the tab "Getting Your Transcripts Evaluated" on your MyResU page. If you do not have a MyResU page, please create one here: <http://my.resu.edu/inquiryform>

*You can only have up to 6 missing pre-requisite courses by the time you start the program.



What does the schedule look like for this program?

The RN to MSN program is available 100% online or in a hybrid format for the first 21 credits completed, as that will complete the BSN level courses. Students take one class at a time and each class lasts about 7 weeks.

If I start the program and decide to not continue to the MSN, can I still leave with a BSN?

Yes. Once you pass and complete the 21 credits needed at ResU for the BSN part of the program (and 100% of your pre-requisite courses are completed), you can leave with your BSN degree if you change your mind about continuing on to the MSN level courses.

When can I start?

We enroll every Fall and Spring for this program.

What is the application deadline?

Fall application deadline is July 15th (or until seats are filled)

Spring application deadline is November 15th (or until seats are filled)



What is the application process?

You will need to complete your application form on your MyResU page. If you do not have one already, please create that here: <http://my.resu.edu/inquiryform> and be sure to obtain a transcript evaluation before applying.

Once your application for admission is on file, you will need to submit all supplemental documents to complete your file. The documents include official transcripts from each college/university that you have attended, a resume, and a copy of your active RN License.



How long does it take to receive a decision?

Once the application process is completed, you will receive an admissions decision within 2-4 week.
